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Light to Night Singapore 2026: "The Power in Us"

Light to Night Singapore 2026 marks the 10th edition of the festival, and for the first time, it will extend across four weekends from 9 to 31 January 2026.

Anchored by the theme of "The Power in Us," the festival celebrates the collective strength that emerges when people and communities come together to reflect, converse and create with the help of art. This edition explores how the power of unity can shape shared experiences and spark new possibilities. Audiences can look forward to interactive art installations, façade projections, performances and programmes that invite participation in unexpected ways.

Artists and collaborators will respond to the theme by addressing three core concepts:


- "Memory and Modernity in Dialogue: Negotiating Pasts and Presents" explores how history, heritage and tradition continue to shape contemporary life.
- "Crafting Unity from Duality: The Synthesis of Opposites" presents the concept of "duality" not as conflict, but as a unifying force that can create something entirely new and transcendent.
- "From Spectator to Co-Creator: The Rise of Participatory and Socially Engaged Art" highlights community-centred and participatory artistic practices and engagements across Singapore, Southeast Asia and beyond.

Spearheaded by National Gallery Singapore, programme collaborators for this edition include the Asian Civilisations Museum, Arts House Group, CQ @ Clarke Quay, Funan, Plaza Singapura, Raffles City Singapore, Singapore Symphony Orchestra, and Victoria Theatre and Concert Hall. During the festival, these institutions located in the historical Civic District will demonstrate the transformative potential of art.

Light to Night Singapore 2026 complements the Gallery's major exhibitions, including *Fear No Power: Women Imagining Otherwise*, featuring the artistic practices of five remarkable Southeast Asian artists, and *Into the Modern: Impressionism from the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston*, the largest showcase of French Impressionism ever presented in Southeast Asia.

Rumah Laut (Coastal Home) is a three-part installation that reimagines the legacy, displacement, and resilience of Singapore's Indigenous Orang Laut communities, including the Orang Gelam, Orang Kallang, Orang Seletar and Orang Selat.

Situated at the Art Connector, Padang and ACM Green, the work reflects on histories of navigation, dwelling and subsistence that have been progressively eroded through urbanisation, land reclamation and the loss of access to coastal spaces. Together, the installation responds to both the tangible and intangible losses experienced by these communities over the past few decades of culture, space, knowledge and belonging.



The Looking Glass of Language explores how the written word operates both as a means of communication and a pathway to understanding, where symbols are endlessly rearranged to create new meanings. The installation's mirrored surface, together with the physical interaction between audience and artwork, frames language as not just something that we simply learn, but instead as a living, energetic process revealed through human encounter.

Art Installation



Untitled Gathering transforms the simple act of sitting into a reflection on cultural memory, connection and shared agency. Its hand-painted wooden furniture pieces carry batik-inspired motifs. Visitors are invited to sit, move and rearrange the pieces, thus becoming co-creators of an ever-shifting composition. The work highlights the quiet power of collective action and the everyday gestures that bring people together.


