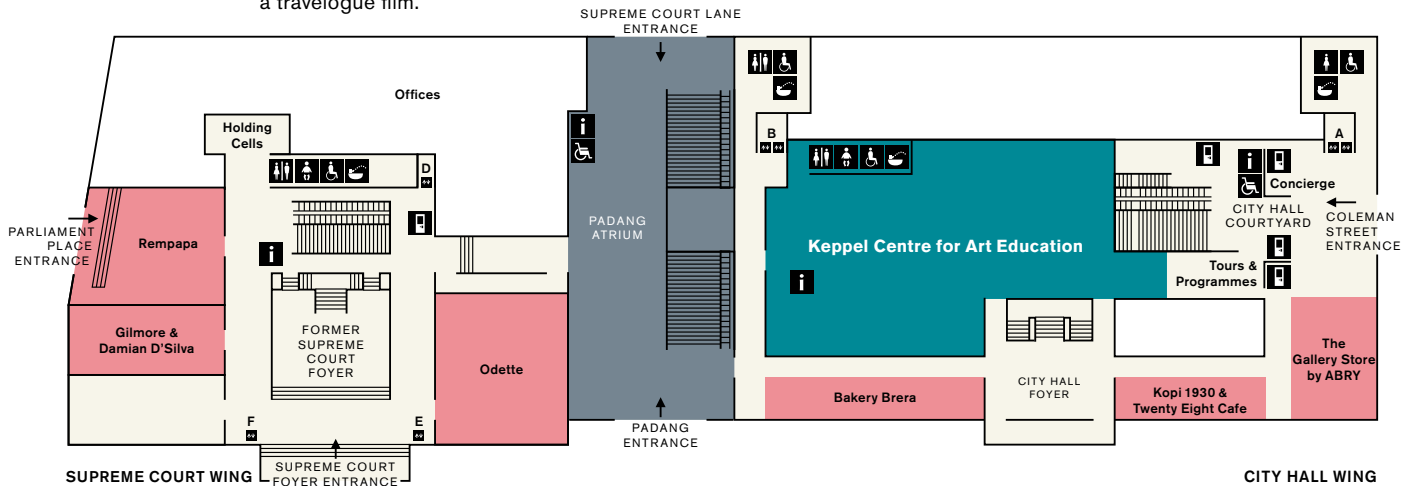

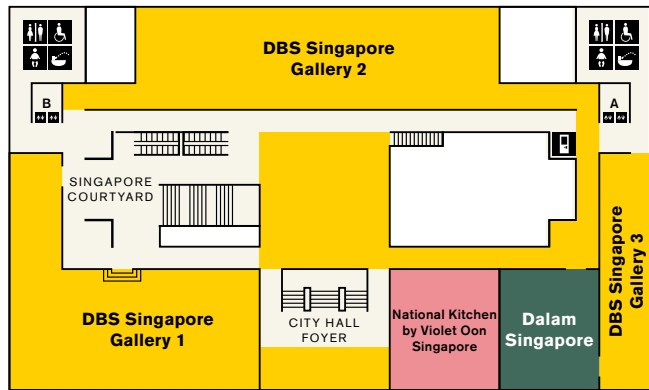

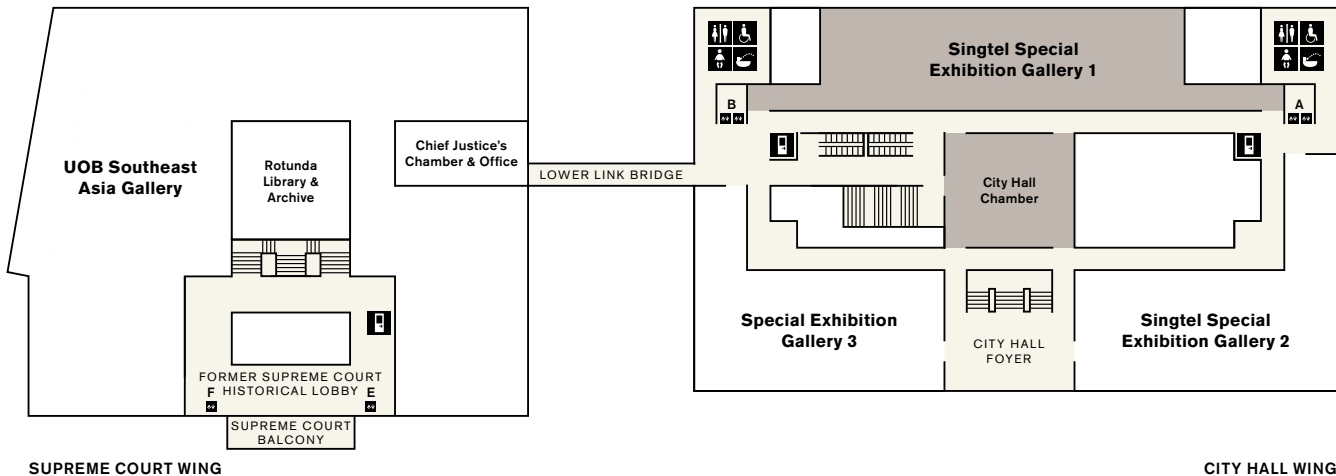

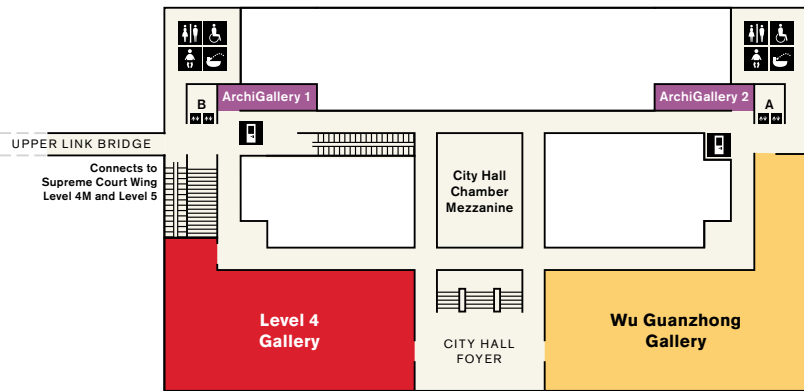
He Xiangning: Ink & Intent

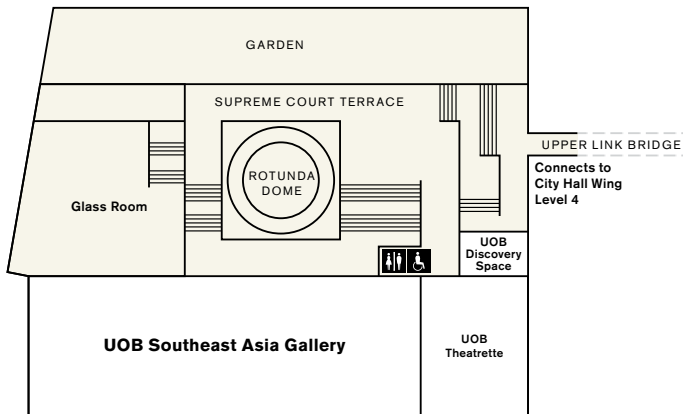
Supreme Court Terrace

Built around the Rotunda dome, this stunning space blends old and new architecture with a glass and metal canopy that bathes it in filtered natural light.

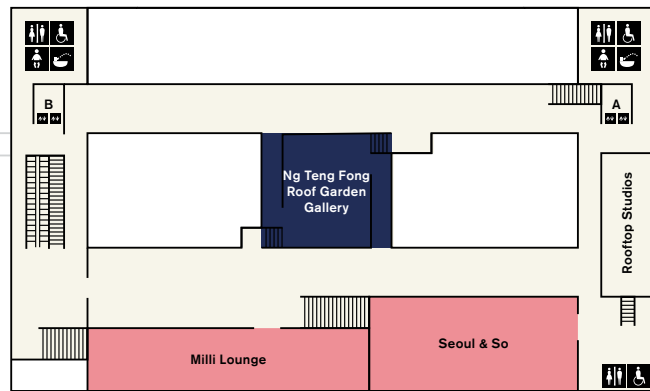


Ng Teng Fong Roof Garden Commission: *Temple* by Tuan Andrew Nguyen

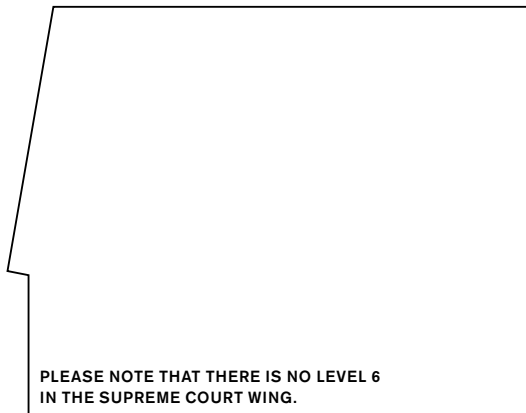

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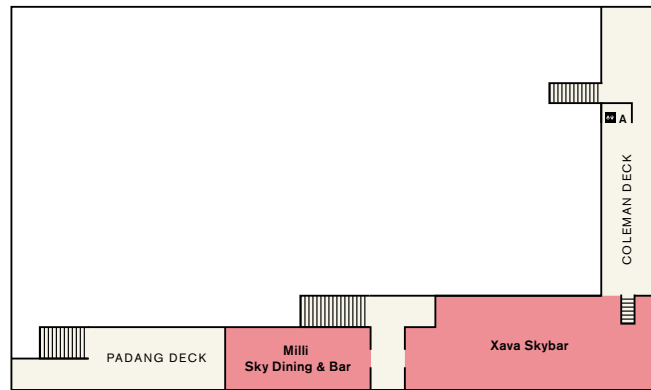
Padang Deck
