**National Gallery Singapore Opening Weekend Road Closures**

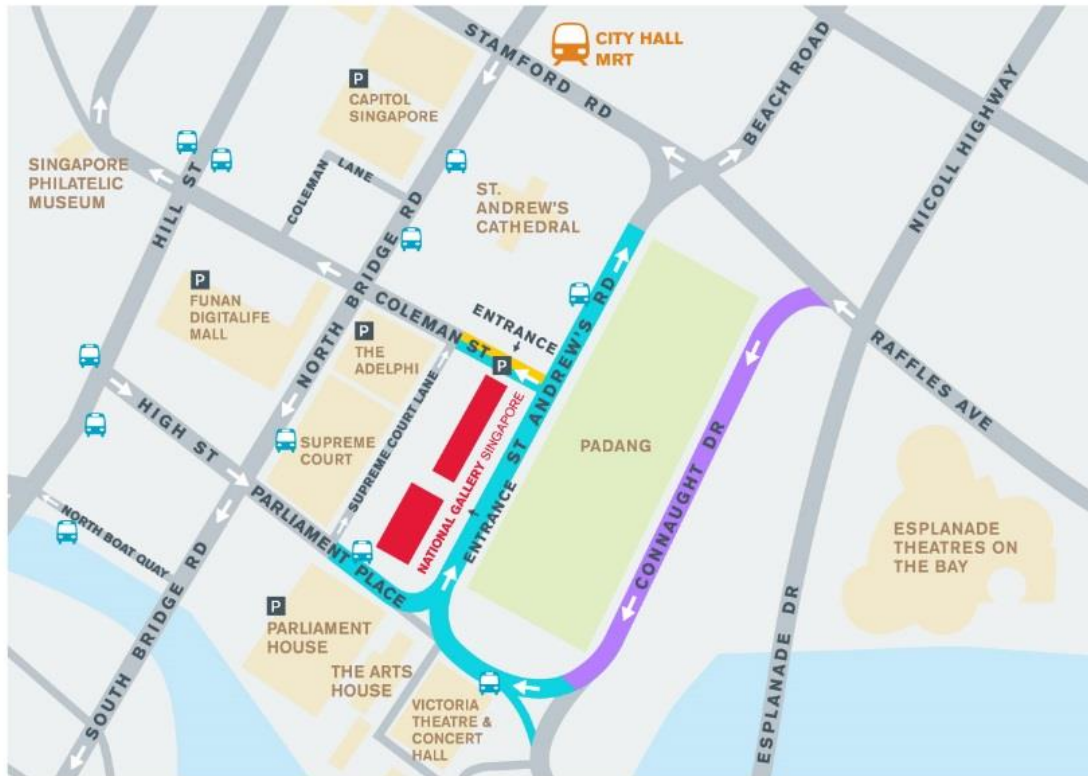
**Singapore, 21 November 2015** – Roads around the National Gallery Singapore and Padang area will be affected by the Gallery’s Art Carnival: *Share the Hope* from 23 Nov and 25 to 29 November.

The affected roads are Coleman Street, St Andrew’s Road, Parliament Place, Connaught Drive, and Fullerton Road. These will be closed fully or partially during stipulated hours to facilitate Opening Celebration events, rehearsals and crowd movement at the Art Carnival.

Visitors to the Gallery and the Art Carnival held at the Padang are encouraged to take public transport. The Gallery is linked to City Hall MRT station via Art Connector, a sheltered walkway featuring portraits of Singaporeans from all walks of life.
