Kumari Nahappan's artwork Wings of Change features an enormous saga seed, an object that has endless possibilities. Kumari's luminescent saga seed symbolises energy and hope. Her artwork draws attention to the saga tree, whose population has declined over the years. It speaks of the urgent need for preservation, conservation and sustainability in today's world, particularly in the context of climate change.

Next to the seed is a pod, a massive reservoir of energy that is waiting to be harnessed, standing as a powerful endorsement for climate action and reminding festivalgoers of their role as stewards of National Gallery Singapore




Wishful Thinking
