Getting to the Exhibition

The exhibition is located at City Hall Chamber on Level 3 of the City Hall Wing.

From Coleman Street Entrance: Proceed to Lift Lobby A and take the accessible lift to Level 3. From Lift Lobby A, proceed down the hallway to the City Hall Chamber. The exhibition entrance is located near the flight of stairs from Singapore Courtyard.

Nearest Lift Lobby: If you are coming from elsewhere in the Gallery, the nearest lift lobby to the exhibition is Lift Lobby B.

Entrance and Exit: Please note that step-free entrance to the exhibition is located at the side of the main entrance exhibition, opposite Singtel Special Exhibition Gallery 1.

Accessible Toilets: The nearest accessible toilets are located near Lift Lobbies A and B. Please note that you will need to open a heavy manual door to get to the accessible toilets.

Drinking Fountains & Baby Changing Rooms: Drinking fountains and baby changing rooms are also located near Lift Lobbies A and B.

General Exhibition Accessibility

Warning: Section 4, *Connect* features a photography room that has bright red lights to simulate a photography dark room. This lighting will dim slightly when the audioplay is activated. Please also note that Section 5, *Relate* features bright lighting with slight flickering. Do exercise caution when entering these spaces.

Wheelchair Accessibility: The exhibition is wheelchair-accessible. However, please note there is no wheelchair access to the table at Section 5, *Relate* due to the lack of knee space.

Seating: Seating is available throughout the exhibition but limited. Please note that the seats do not have armrests or backrests.

Lighting: The exhibition space is generally dimly lit to protect the works displayed for conservation purposes. Please mind your step.

Interactive Displays: Please note that the screen of the video display at *Project Citizens* may be too high for wheelchair users or children to access. However, the [videos are available for viewing online](#).

Exhibition Content:

- Exhibition texts are available in English, Malay, Tamil and Chinese.
- Subtitles in English, Malay, Tamil and Chinese are also available for all audio plays in the exhibition.

Gallery hosts are stationed throughout the exhibition for any additional support you may require.
