# **Getting to the Festival**

The Gallery Children's Biennale is a fun festival with eight artworks that will engage all your senses. The artworks can be found on Level B1 and Level 1 of both the City Hall Wing and Supreme Court Wing.

**Wayfinding**: For more information about the detailed locations of each artwork, please visit the website or pick up a copy of the *Biennale Buddy* from the Visitor Services Counter.

Accessible Toilets: Accessible toilets are located near Lift Lobbies A and B, in the City Hall Wing. Please note that you will need to open a heavy manual door to get to the accessible toilet at Level B1.

**Drinking Fountains and Baby Changing Rooms:** Drinking fountains and baby changing rooms are located near Lift Lobbies A and B in the City Hall Wing.

#### **General Festival Accessibility**

**General Advisory:** Gallery Children's Biennale is highly multi-sensory, and includes experiences that feature moving lights, sounds and bright colours. During peak hours, large crowds are also to be expected. If you need a quiet space to calm down, please visit the Calm Room at Level B1, City Hall Wing.

**Wheelchair Accessibility**: There is a wheelchair-friendly route that connects all the artworks so that you can easily explore the event. Most artworks have step-free access and are wheelchair accessible, except for *Fantasy*. Please refer to **Artworks to Note** for more information.

**Seating**: Seating is only available for certain artworks. If you need to rest, seats can be found along the Spine Hall at Level B1, City Hall Wing and outside the Keppel Centre for Art Education at Level 1, City Hall Wing.

**Lighting**: The artworks are generally well-lit, except for *Lessons in Being Kind, Imaginary Peach Garden* and *Dance Dance Chromatics*. Please mind your step.

**Stroller Parking**: There are special areas designated for stroller parking around the different installations. You will be asked to leave your stroller in these areas while you explore the artworks.

**Festival Content:** Festival content is only available in English. Large prints and Braille versions of the artwork labels are available at standees located at...
