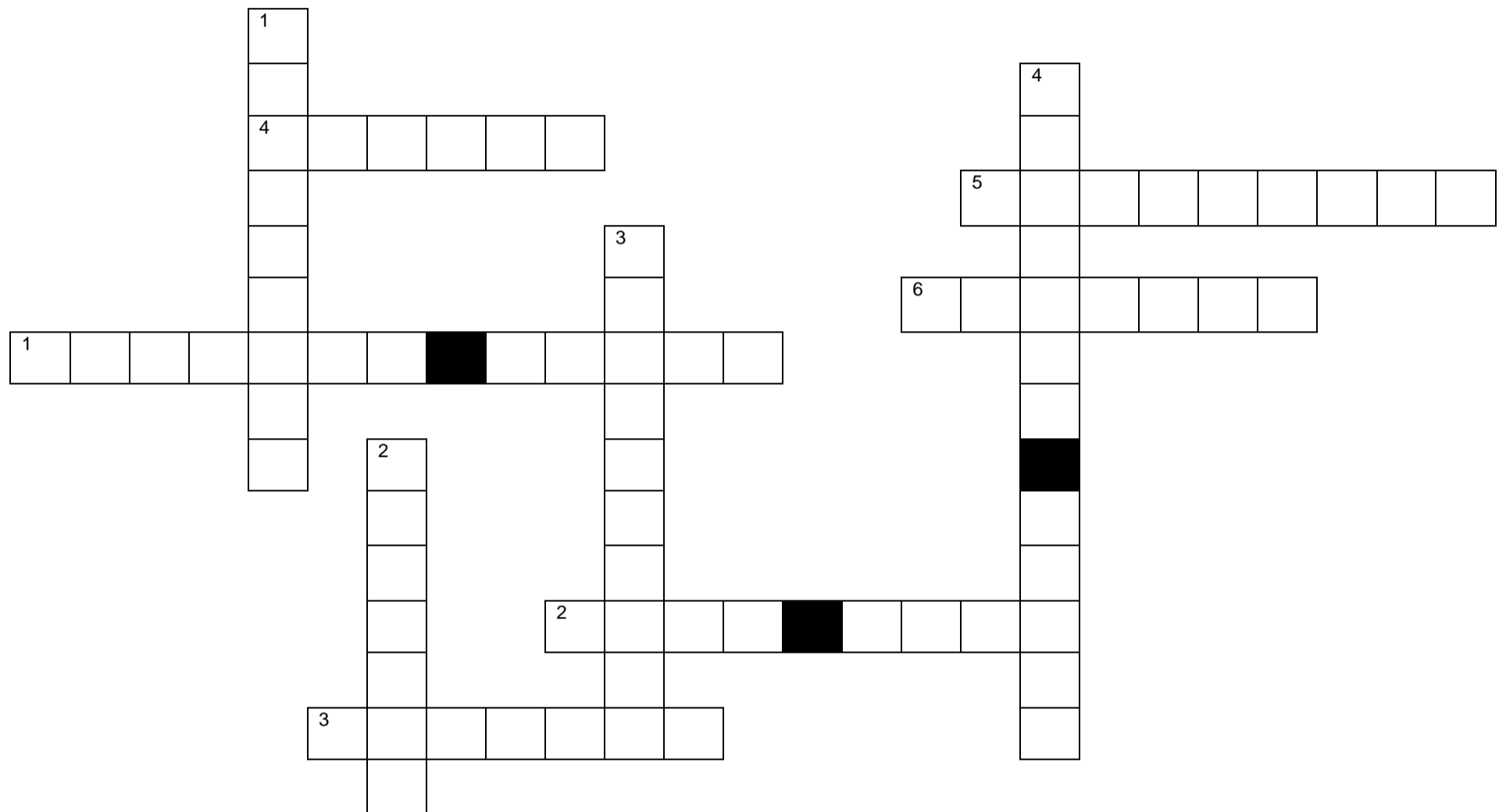


# HISTORICAL PLACES

Did you know that National Gallery Singapore is housed in two national monuments? Explore various architectural features in the Gallery using this crossword puzzle.

*Note to parents: This activity will require you to walk to several locations in the Gallery. These locations are a 5 to 7-minute walk from Keppel Centre for Art Education.*



## ACROSS

*Go to the Padang Atrium.*

- National Gallery Singapore occupies two historical buildings. One of these used to house court rooms, judges' chambers and a law library. It was the former \_\_\_\_\_.
- The other building was an important government office known as \_\_\_\_\_.
- Look at the façade of the City Hall building. The grand pillars between the windows are called Corinthian \_\_\_\_\_.
